MEMORANDUM FROM THE DEAN

TOPIC: Darfur Sunday at Christ Church Cathedral – September 13th, 2009

For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me.

This quote from the twenty-fifth chapter of the Gospel of Matthew begins to describe the theological imperative which compels us, as Christians, to relieve the suffering of the people of Darfur. We invite you join us in a coalition of churches, synagogues, mosques and secular organizations to bring peace and comfort to Darfur.

We especially solicit your attendance on Sunday, September 13th for a “Darfur Sunday” of prayers for the reconciliation of the Sudan conflicts that have thus far taken more than 400,000 lives and displaced 2.7 million in neighboring African countries.

Xavier University’s Rabbi Abie Ingber will be the preacher at both 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. services, with a “Conversation with the Rabbi” forum at 9:00. Scriptures will be read in Hebrew, Arabic, Luganda, and English languages. A reception will follow the services.
